About the Conference

The current conference, which is the fifth one, has been designed to highlight results of interdisciplinary geoarchaeological research by specialists from a broad field of disciplines in the humanities and geosciences. The objective is to work towards building a platform for meaningful exchange of information and experience among archaeologists, geologists, geographers, climatologists and researchers from related fields. Meetings in this forum and cooperation between different specialists will hopefully lead to new research projects and initiatives, contributing to broaden knowledge of man's interactions with the natural environment.

Conference Scope

This year conference will lay special emphasis on presentation of issues connected to decline of the Late Antiquity and emergence of the so-called Late Antiquity/Migration Period (3rd – 7th century AD) in the light of geoarchaeological records from the eastern Mediterranean, eastern Adriatic and adjacent regions such as Balkans and central Europe as well. It is a paradox that despite the large number of historical and archaeological sources, the period of decline of the Roman Empire and advent of the Migration Period often related as Dark Ages is very little known from the point of view of the environmental and climatic changes, which without a doubt had a huge impact on the cultural and political changes taking place at the time - often described as societal collapse of the Old World.

Submitted papers can present field and laboratory research focusing on the conference theme, carried out with a broad range of methodologies, including geomorphological, sedimentological, mineralogical, pedological, palynological, palaeobotanical and other analyses. Participation of specialists actively involved in interdisciplinary archaeological projects in Croatia and adjacent countries is particularly encouraged.
